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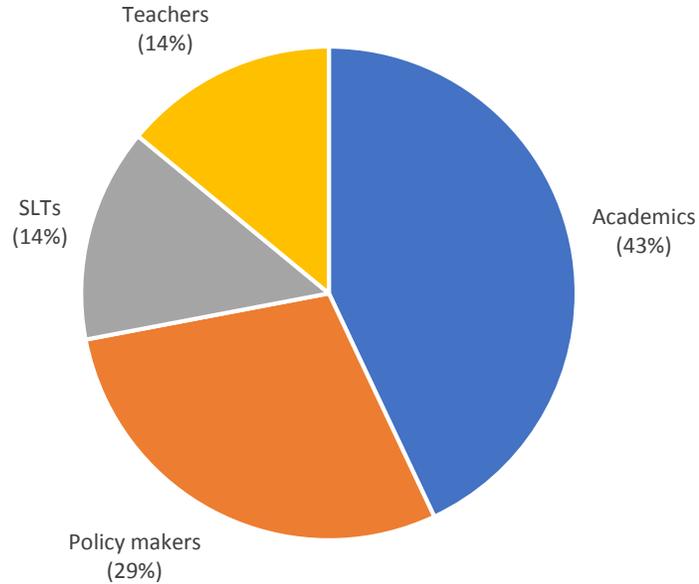

Which events were assessed?

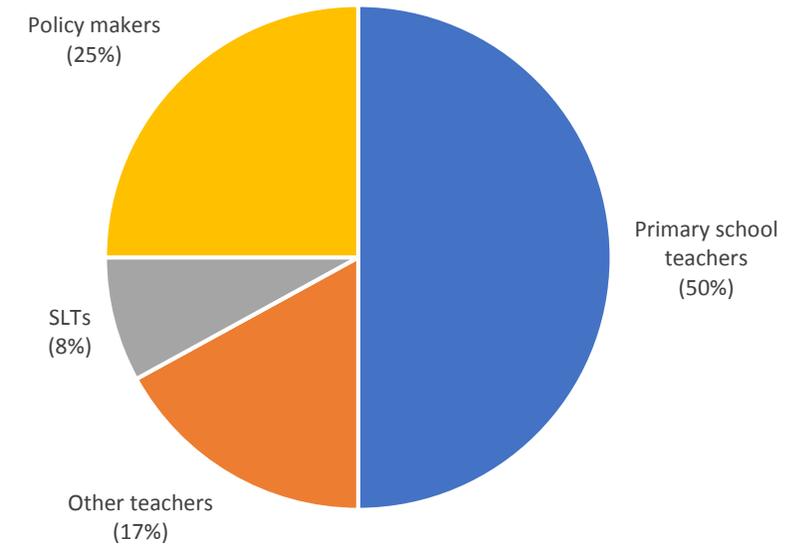
- **World café on childhood bilingualism** (May 3rd 2018)

Who were the participants?

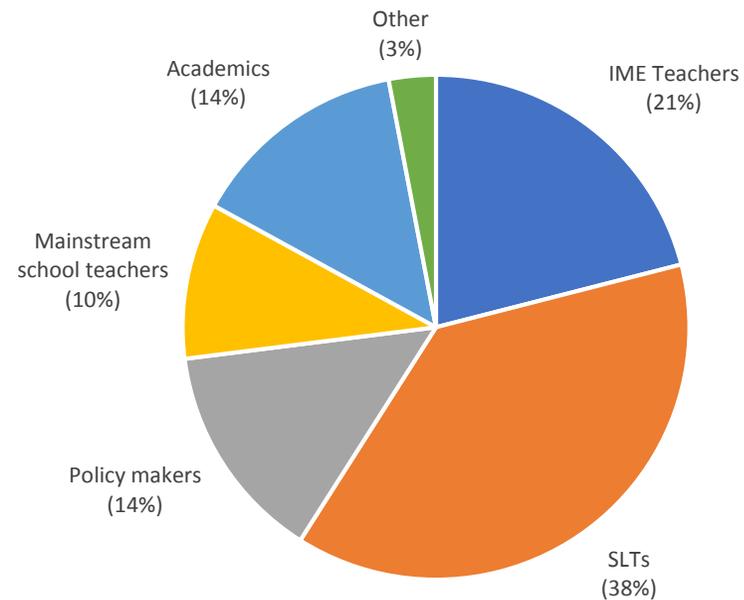

What did they find most useful?

- Meeting people:

“Great to meet with people from different professional backgrounds and with varying insights.” (Academic, World café)

- Sharing experiences:

“It was really good to meet other teachers with different experience re. teaching.” (Teacher, Workshop)

- Getting resources:

“It gave lots of ideas to bring back to the classroom.” (Teacher, Workshop)

What did they find most useful? (cont.)

- Hearing about research:

“Good to have research to provide to parents to help inform their decision re. educational placement.” (SLT, Panel)

“I learned that Irish medium school is a possible choice for my child.” (Parent, Panel)

“Making informed decisions regarding how to balance bilingualism/multilingualism at home” (Parent, panel)

- Getting reassurance:

“Great to see that so many professionals are working and researching the subject.” (Policy maker, World café)

“I gained confidence in my parenting.” (Parent, Panel)

What can we learn from their feedback?

- Most participants to such events are expecting to **hear about research**.
- Being able to **share experiences** is valuable for both parents and professionals.
- **Accessibility** should be improved to reach more people and more stakeholders.
- Collaboration should be **ongoing**:

“This day has only scratched the surface” (SLT, World café)
